- BULLYING: AN UNWANTED, AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOR THAT INVOLVES A REAL OR
  PERCEIVED POWER IMBALANCE. CAN BE ONE INCIDENT OR REPEATED.
- BUILYING CAN OCCUR BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL HOURS, IN A SCHOOL BUILDING, ON A PLAYGROUND, ON A SCHOOL BUS WHILE A STUDENT IS TRAVELING TO OR FROM SCHOOL, OR ON THE INTERNET.
- CYBERBULLYING OCCURS WHEN HARASSMENT OR BULLYING HAPPENS THROUGH

  ANY FORM OF ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION.

### RESTORATIVE PRACTICES HELP MAKE THINGS RIGHT

- STUDENTS LEARN FROM THEIR MISTAKES AND UNDERSTAND WHY THEIR BEHAVIOR WAS UNACCEPTABLE.
- STUDENTS ACKNOWLEDGE THE HARM CAUSED OR NEGATIVE IMPACT OF THEIR ACTIONS.
- STUDENTS UNDERSTAND WHAT COULD HAVE BEEN DONE DIFFERENTLY.
- STUDENTS TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR ACTIONS.
- STUDENTS LEARN STRATEGIES THAT PROMOTE POSITIVE INTERACTIONS.

### OUR CODE STRESSES THESE DETAILS:

- BE POLITE, LISTEN WHEN OTHERS ARE SPEAKING, AND MAINTAIN MUTUAL RESPECT.
- BE FAMILIAR WITH ALL OF THE RULES.
- Work your hardest.
- MANAGE YOUR EMOTIONS AND REACTIONS AND RESOLVE CONFLICT WITH OTHERS.
- SEEK HELP FROM PEERS, TEACHERS, FACULTY, AND ADMINISTRATORS IN SOLVING PROBLEMS.
- Dress appropriately for school and School Functions.

### KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!

#### ALL STUDENTS HAVE THE RIGHT TO . . .

- PARTICIPATE IN AIL SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTIVITIES ON AN EQUAL BASIS REGARDLESS OF
  THEIR ACTUAL OR PERCEIVED RACE, WEIGHT, COLOR, NATIONAL ORIGIN, ETHNIC GROUP,
  RELIGION, RELIGIOUS PRACTICE, GENDER, SEX, SEXUAL ORIENTATION OR DISABILITY.
- SEEK HELP WHEN RIGHTS HAVE BEEN OBSTRUCTED.
- EXPRESS THEIR OPINIONS AS LONG AS IT IS DONE IN A RESPECTFUL WAY, AND DOES NOT CONTAIN HATEFUL OR HURTFUL SPEECH.
- RIGHT TO PRESENT THEIR TRUTH, AND RECEIVE CONSEQUENCES BASED ON THE SITUATION.
- Have access to school policies, regulations and rules, and their meanings.

- Dress Code!

### BE RESPONSIBLE AND KEEP OUR SCHOOL SAFE!

- + Tell an adult if someone is not following the rules, or you don't feel safe.
- + STAND UP FOR SOMEONE IF YOU THINK THEY ARE A VICTIM.
- + Don't be afraid to say "No" or "Stop" if someone is making you uncomfortable and tell an adult.
- + REMEMBER THAT EVERYONE DESERVES TO FEEL SAFE IN SCHOOL.
