At the start of each school year, parents are invited to review the Syosset Board of Education policies. As the weather is getting warmer, I would like all families and students to be mindful of the Student Dress Code, and review it. Please view the excerpt below from the Syosset Central School District's Code of Character, Conduct and Support regarding appropriate student dress (Policy #5300):

**SYOSSET CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT CODE OF CHARACTER, CONDUCT AND SUPPORT Policy 5300**

*“All students are expected to give proper attention to personal cleanliness and to dress appropriately for school and school functions. These expectations are designed to aid students in character development by cultivating their respect for self and others. Students and their parents have the primary responsibility for acceptable student dress and appearance.*

*A student's dress, grooming and appearance, shall:*

- *be safe, appropriate, and not disrupt or interfere with the educational process.*
- *not be extremely brief. See through garments are not appropriate and are disruptive to the learning environment.*
- *include footwear at all times. Footwear that is a safety hazard will not be allowed.*
- *not include the wearing of hats in the classroom except for a medical or religious purpose.*

We continue to enforce safe, closed shoes on a daily basis. Flip flops, sandals, slippers, and crocs are considered unsafe. Students will be unable to fully participate in Phys Ed or recess if they come to school in these types of footwear.
